
FATAL DUEL OVER AN ACTRESS.

A Detective Shot Dead by His Rival, a Liveryman, in Savannah, Ga.

SAVANNAH, Ga., Nov. 19.—City Detective Jerry Shea was shot and instantly killed to-night by John J. Hart in front of Carson's livery stable, of which Hart is manager. The tragedy resulted from the infatuation of both men with a variety actress named Lizzie Johnson at the Alhambra Music Hall.

There had been several passages between them on account of the woman previously. Shea approached Hart at his place of business to-night and the quarrel was renewed. Shea was an athlete and Hart a smaller man. Hart called in Policeman Sheehan to arrest Shea. Sheehan refused. As Shea advanced toward Hart the latter pulled a pistol and fired. After the bullet had gone through his breast Shea drew and fired one shot and fell dead.
