

Death Notices

- Usually are one or two lines.
- Include the deceased's name and age.
- Include name of funeral home or crematory.
- Usually appear a day or two after death.
- Usually free.





- Usually published in local and hometown newspapers.
- May include a photo.
- Are now considered to be classified ads.

He was active in his community serving on many boards and with community organizations, including the Historic Savannah Foundation, the Telfair Academy of Arts and Sciences, the Savannah Arts Commission, the Savannah Council of World Affairs, and the Gilmer Lecture Series Fund. Mr. **Gannam** was a former president of the Savannah Bar Association and served on the Board of Governors of the State Bar of Georgia from 1968 to 1999.

He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Marion DeFrank **Gannam**; four children, James **Gannam** and Cynthia Heitger, Ann **Gannam** and Dan Gourde, Elizabeth and Ron Jorde, and Joe **Gannam** and Melanie Marks; and three grandchildren, Joshua, Nathan, and Joseph **Gannam**.

Karam George Gannam, 100, of 8 Durant Ave., father of Savannah's first World War II hero, Sgt. George K. Gannam, died Friday at Memorial Medical Center almost exactly 39 years after his son's death at Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941.

The father was a native of Sidon, Lebanon, and was one of a number of Lebanese Christians who moved to Savannah. He was a communicant of Sacred Heart Roman Catholic Church.

He became an American citizen in 1952, but his patriotic feelings for America were expressed publicly year after year, especially from 1945, when members of American Legion Post 184, named for his son, began holding an annual memorial ceremony on Pearl Harbor Day on the parade ground at that hero's alma mater, Benedictine Military School.

As Mr. Gannam and his family knew, the ceremony bonors all of Chatham County's war dead. Yet each year the new flag raised during the Dec. 7 event was given to Karam Gannam. He built a flagstaff in the yard behind his grocery store and residence at Hopkins and 53rd streets and held daily flag-raising and lowering ceremonies.

An editorial in the Savannah Morning News on Dec. 10, 1957, described Mr. Gannam's picture at that year's rain-swept and windy Pearl Harbor ceremony: "News photogra-

pher Andy Hickman was there, and his picture of Karam Gamam, father of George, with head bowed in prayer was one of the most poignant we have ever seen.


