### INFLUENCE AND THE EFFECT OF COLOR ON THE MIND.

A noted Author once said, "All good color is in some degree pensive and the purest and most thoughtful minds are those which love color most."

The effect of Color on Health, Wealth and Happiness is a subject of far more importance than can be imagined. Few people realize that colors effect them, but such is the fact.

#### RED.

From experience it may generally be inferred that red is an undesirable color, for it places one at once under the dominion of Mars, which symbolizes warfare, quarrels, opposition. A bull is crazed by a red rag. Red is always the signal of danger. Red can be distinguished at a greater distance than any other. A red light can be seen further than any other. People of a quick temper, restless, nervous, combative, or who have brain trouble, should avoid red. On the other hand, those lacking in vitality, energy, and persons of an uncertain nature or purpose will do well to wear lots of red. Red is tonic, excitant, stimulant, and signifies love, wisdom and loyalty.

#### BLUE.

This is a better color in many respects. Persons who wear lots of blue accomplish all things undertaken. They easily accumulate wealth and prominence. It is the color of true love, art, music, happiness. Blue is soothing, quieting and health-giving. Blue signifies constancy and fidelity.

#### YELLOW.

This is the color of the sun, and of gold and denotes wealth, luxury, enjoyment, pleasure, faith, hope and charity. Yellow is a nerve animating, laxative color. Yellow brings brightness of disposition and optimism. A yellow house, sign or writing paper always inspires confidence and faithfulness.

#### GREEN.

This is the color of vegetation and signifies abundance. Green means success only by persistent effort. It means peace, rest, repose and is the opposite to red. Persons who wear green generally keep in the background; they are quiet and have little to say. Green is used as a signal on railroads and ships to signify that everything is safe and all right to go ahead. Green signifies hope, victory and immortality.

#### WHITE.

This is a symbol of innocence, purity, light, energy, joy, clean and simple. Anything that is white is therefore good, chaste, healthful, natural, beneficial.

#### BLACK.

Black corresponds to night and symbolizes the negative principle. Black represents inaction, death, the opposite of life and energy and is used as a fitting emblem of mourning. Black should never be worn if it can be avoided (unless at night.)

Black affects the health badly; it is a devitalizing element; it takes the life or vitality out of a person; it affects the mind with sadness. Black takes all the joy and gladness out of life. Black acts against success, repelling all that is good, and creates adversity. Black means poverty, sickness, death and denotes extravagance, the opposite to economy.

#### PURPLE.

From the most ancient times purple has been associated with all that is royal, kingly, splendid, elevated, noble, great, exalted and magnanimous. Purple is a lucky color to have about or to wear.

#### VIOLET.

Signifies love, truth, passion and despair. In other respects violet is similar to purple.

#### BROWN.

Brown is the color that represents thought, study and intelligence. It is a quiet, astute and harmonious color. Brown harmonizes with most any other. Brown is warm, subdued and independent. Brown indicates capacity, perseverance, inspiration, reason, prudence and judgement. Persons who wear brown are generally healthy, long lived and happy; it is a good color and shows self-confidence.

#### GRAY.

This color is an emblem of Saturn, subdued, sober, determined, positive, hard and calculating. Beware of gray eyes, or the person who always wears gray clothes.

#### CHECKS.

These represent broken conditions, disappointments, and denotes evil tendencies the extent and strength of which is to be judged by the prevailing color.

#### PLAIDS.

These denote eccentricities, vagrancies, and are the most dangerous colors one can trifle with. The wearers of plaids are always uneasy, unsettled, and usually poor. The prevailing colors give a clue to the mind and affairs.

#### MATERIAL.

The materials with which ones clothes are composed should also be considered. The finer and more delicate the material the better the influence, and the farther one gets away from animal coverings the better for freedom of conditions. For this reason vegetable fabrics are better than wool. Silk is delicate and refined but not always healthy. Linen is preferable to cotton for clothing and cotton felt better than leather for shoes.

A study of colors will show how we may aid ourselves in the matter of dress and thus better fit ourselves to achieve success, health, wealth and happiness.

## PRACTICAL CHARACTER READING.

If you know the weak and strong characteristics of people you will be able to control and influence them. Take heed to the following delineation and the lives of people will be as open for you to read as a book. Character is plainly written in every man or woman's face, and he who looks may read. If every person knew this or realized this fact perhaps there would be more care taken to wipe out peevish and bad tempered lines or a sly, deceitful tilt of the eyelids. A polished villain often fools the shrewdest of men or women; a silver tongue with silver tact is quality that wins. But nature stamps her marks in various places upon the human form. Our thoughts manifest themselves through our nerves, causing the nervous system to play an important part in the recording of these marks upon form, head, face, palm and in the handwriting of an individual, making it an easy matter for one who makes human nature a study to distinguish the rogue from the gentleman or lady, also by looking in any person's face be able to tell what kind of character that individual has, and what they would be best suited for. Every feature is indicative of character. A club woman has different features from a home maker. A suffragette could never by any chance be mistaken for a musician. Every feature has its significance; the color of the eyes, the tilt of the nose and the curve of the cheek, each has a meaning all of its own. Every living face is a bulletin board of thought, moulded first by inherited character and thereafter by the thoughts and passions that most often move that face to expression.

The muscles that are moved by hatred, anger, benevolence, wisdom, courage, etc., develop or contract certain muscles in the face. The muscles thus affected by the most frequently recurring thoughts become shrunken or developed, as the case may be.

The Eyes—Dark brown or black eyes denote an impetuous temperament, capable of great extremes of feeling, likes and dislikes, and passionate ardor in romantic love. Brown eyes denote those traits in a less intense degree, the temperament becoming more placid as the brown grows lighter. Of soft, dark brown eyes, take care; beware. An affectionate disposition, sweet and gentle, accompanies the russet brown eye which is not yellowish. Yellowish brown eyes denote an inconstant disposition, with little or no will power. The ideal of sublime purity of the affections is found in violet or dark blue eyes. Clear light blue eyes, calm and tranquil, denote a cheerful, constant nature, with intellectual powers and the passions well balanced. Gray eyes denote intellect, always and everywhere. Pale blue eyes denote coldness and selfishness. Blue eyes with greenish tints accompany a predominance of the intellectual powers over the passions, a nature ruled by wisdom and sustained by a great moral courage, which may attain high position. Greenish gray eyes are the most intellectual, and if in them may be seen varying shades of blue and orange we find the strange mixture of the sour and the sweet, of optimism and pessimism, which produces the impressionable temperament of the genius. Eyes with a preponderance of greenish shade denote coquetry and the most artful deceitfulness. Eyes of dead color, dull and expressionless, bespeak a sluggish temperament, listless disposition, and a cold, selfish nature with a critical attitude toward life. A calm, steadfast glance from a tranquil blue eye, usually large, denotes a clear conscience, sweet, gentle disposition and generous nature. Hazel eyes that light up frequently and sparkle with life denote a fickle disposition. The greater width between the

eyes the more susceptible and impressionable the intellect. Eyes set close together are not to be trusted, they mean the kind of stupidity that goes with sly wickedness, accompanying the obtuse, obstinate nature.

The smaller the eyes the greater the extremes of feeling of which the owner is capable. Large eyes denote calmness, constancy and patience. Eyes deeply set denote determination, courage, and gentility. Bulging eyes denote culture, refinement, yet some times a selfish, harsh temperament.

The Hair—Dark hair denotes great bodily strength, wiry muscles and an energetic, determined and persevering character. Light hair denotes a lively character, genial, versatile, impulsive and notes a character marked by vividness of conception, intensity of emotion, liveliness of imagination and refinement of tastes.

The Head—A relatively large head denotes a great mental temperament. A broad head denotes great courage. A small head denotes a delicate temperament. A narrow head is that of a coward.

The Chin—A receding chin shows weakness of character. It is a sign of people who give up easy and allow others to overbear them. A pointed chin is a sign of peevish, fretful disposition, without strength, but vixenish, with a marked tendency toward teasing and have ideals which are not easily satisfied. A narrow chin denotes congenial love, a love exactly adapted for oneself. A dented chin is found with a temperament that desires to be loved and are people who hunger for affection and are miserable without some one to care for them. A broad round chin denotes devoted attraction, often accompanied by jealousy and distrust, yet is a person benevolent and charitable, also shows a lasting affection and esteem, self control and a determined will power. A square chin indicates a stubborn disposition and firm decision.

The Mouth—Large mouths are indicative of more character than small ones.

The Lips—Full lips are a sign of an affectionate disposition, thin lips of the reverse. The weak person does not close the lips firmly, the lower lip is pendulous and loose. Coarse, irregularly formed lips indicate strength, hospitality, jealousy, also firmness. A long upper lip denotes a natural born whiner and nagger of the unpleasant, useless and helpless kind, while a short upper lip with a cupid's bow shows a fickle nature.

The Nose—A pointed nose, as everyone practically knows, denotes a prying position. Beware of the person with this feature, as they will never rest until they know your business. The Roman nose indicates executiveness, one who conquers; warriors, statesmen and other famous men and women of all ages have had noses of the Roman Type. The Greek nose denotes refinement, artistic taste and great love of the beautiful things agreeable to their tastes. The hawk, or Jew nose, indicates commercialism, wordly shrewdness, insight into character and ability to turn this insight to a profitable account. The pug or snub nose has made no legible mark on the record of this world's progress. Napoleon said no person with a short nose ever amounted to much of anything. It is certain that the majority of those who have succeeded have rather prominent noses. Large fleshy nostrils are a sign of money getting and holding.

Laughter—Laughter is another indication of character. Those who seldom laugh but often smile indicates depth of character, intensity of feeling, and thoughtfulness, also self-control. The frequent gigler denotes a shallow thinker. The coarse, loud laughter denotes rudeness combined with contempt. Nearly everyone has his or her method of reading character.

## ALLA AXIOM'S GRAPHOLOGICAL CHART AND CHARACTER DELINEATION.

**DIPLOMACY**—A diplomat is one who is secretive, reserved, cunning, crafty, and evasive; you can not corner him. Lawyers are usually quite diplomatic. The men who control and shape the affairs of governmental policies are diplomats. This is a good quality to possess if used in the right direction. One having a high percentage of diplomacy should seek to develop all the qualities that make the diplomat, and strive to get into a position where he will be able to make this quality pay.

**TACT**—This is a quality essential to success where one is constantly dealing with masses of people. A salesman without tact is a failure. A tactful person has good conversational ability, a pleasing manner, and always a ready excuse. To win the friendship and esteem of others you should be tactful. Scientific flattery is used by the tactful person, and he always finds a way to gain his point or obtain an audience. Such a person is adapted to salesmanship, real estate, promotion of corporations, etc. Coupled with sufficient diplomacy, force and ambition, success in almost any undertaking is sure to follow.

**ACQUISITION**—A high percentage of this quality is an attribute desirable. Coupled with other good characteristics, it brings success. If you are lacking in the desire and power of acquisition, you should start immediately to develop it. Russel Sage, Andrew Carnegie, and many others who are rich attribute their great wealth to their desire of acquiring, first pennies, then dollars. It signifies economy, thrift, frugality, and a desire to own and maintain. Persons with good powers of acquisition are most adapted for banking and the handling of finance.

**WILL POWER**—Where one is lacking in firmness, others are sure to take advantage of him, not only in business, but in all affairs. If the percentage is low, you should strive to cultivate a strong will power, as it gives perseverance, stability, and decision of purpose. This can be done through auto-suggestion. Persons who have a high percentage of will power make good superintendents, disciplinarians, and are capable of managing help. Large corporations, factories, and stores employ for the heads of their various departments people with strong will power, but they must also possess enough tact and magnetism to keep them from being obstinate.

**FORCE**—This quality signifies combativeness, courage, snap, efficiency, defiance, determination; a love of encounter and a desire to defend. Dewey's high percentage of force, also diplomacy, accounts for his being the general and fighter. Most prize fighters have a high percentage of this quality, but are lacking in nearly all other qualities, hence the prize fighter. Persons with a high percentage of this quality are best adapted to positions where they may be called upon at any time to use it. Policemen, guards, watchmen, and athletes all possess a high percentage of force. But when this quality is largely developed and the intellectual faculties also show a high percentage, it signifies that the person is adapted for a higher calling. Roosevelt's force, but other qualities as well, made him the great leader and diplomat.

**SECRECY**—Persons who lack secretiveness would make poor detectives. Those having a high percentage of this quality would make excellent servants for the government. Would also make good conjurors, sleight-of-hand performers, magicians. The desire to be tricky, evasive, and cunning fits one for all positions where double-dealing and management are called for. All diplomats are very secretive. It is a good quality when counter-balanced with honesty and a desire to be just.

**MAGNETISM**—One who is magnetic is agreeable, pleasant, polite, and usually has power to persuade. This is the much sought quality and should be cultivated. It costs nothing to be magnetic and is the means of gaining friends and coveted positions. Magnetic persons succeed where those far more qualified for certain positions fail. If you lack magnetic qualities, your first duty should be to cultivate agreeableness, blandness, complaisance, suavity and the habit of being polite to everybody. A study of the law of suggestion and systems of self-treatment by auto-suggestion will develop personal magnetism. It remains for you to cultivate it. It qualifies you for a better position in life.

**PSYCHIC**—Most psychic individuals are prophetic and are capable of forewarning what is to be. Some are even possessed of second sight. Intuition and spirituality is largely developed in those who have a high percentage of psychic force. If this quality is largely indicated, it should be cultivated to the highest possible degree. It opens many avenues for money making. Character reading and the ability to advise others regarding the future is the line of work most profitable to those who possess a high percentage of psychic power.

**EXPRESSION**—One gifted with a high percentage of the power of expression should be adapted to positions where convincing argument wins success. Most literary writers have the power of expression. Orators, public speakers, and teachers possess it to a great degree. Where the indications from one's character show a fair percentage of this power, every effort should be made to perfect it, and the positions above mentioned sought.

**INTUITION**—If a person has a high percentage of intuition, it indicates power of inductive reasoning; perception of truth, discernment of characters and motives; intuitive reading of men and conditions by minor signs. Such persons make good doctors and healers, as well as readers of character. If the percentage is sufficiently high, the person should study to become a physician. It depends upon the percentage of other characteristics, as to how successful, as a physician, one would be. Concentrated effort in any one direction promotes efficiency.

**COMPUTATION**—The mathematician has great powers of computation; usually a good memory and the ability to reckon figures mentally. If the percentage is high, the person is adapted to accounting, bookkeeping, etc., and should strive to become an expert by concentrated effort in this direction. There is always a demand for accountants and it depends entirely upon the efficiency of the person as to the kind of position obtainable. If other good characteristics are well developed, such as magnetism, tact, and acquisition, there is no limit to the opportunities open to the possessor of these powers. We are what we have made ourselves, and you can be what you wish. Concentrate, and you will win.

**CONSTRUCTION**—Persons with powers of constructing should devote their concentrated energies to all things mechanical. They possess a love of machinery, invention, and are always successful with the use of tools. They make good contractors and builders; possess ingenuity and admire manual skill. It depends as to whether he will be a day laborer, toiling for others, or a leader, compelling others to do the work under his skilled eye and acquiring mind. It lies with ourselves to be slaves or masters.

**KINDNESS**—Some persons are good Samaritans, neighborly, sympathetic and accommodating, self-sacrificing and benevolent. Such persons make good ministers of the Gospel and nurses. If the percentage is high, coupled with other good characteristics, such as powers of expression, tact, and magnetism, the person should be a preacher. If lacking in these qualities the person would be successful as a nurse. Where kindness is largely developed, generosity is indicated. There is such a thing, however, as being generous to a fault, which is a detriment to success. If the power of acquisition is well developed, together with kindness, it indicates that the person is very magnetic.

**MIRTH**—The fun maker; the actor usually has a high percentage of this quality; has a perception of the absurd and ridiculous, and a disposition to joke; is full of wit and humor; is sarcastic and ever ready with a comment on anything improper or unbecoming. If the percentage is sufficiently high, success upon the stage awaits the individual. Many, however, who are developed along other lines possess mirth to a marked degree.

**AMBITION**—A high percentage of ambition indicates a desire to be aristocratic. It also shows pride of character; approbateness; love of praise and publicity, display, esteem, a good name, fashion, social position, and popularity. Such persons succeed in politics. Ambition is also possessed by persons who have a high percentage of other qualities. A careful weighing of the total percentage, as outlined on this chart, should point out what one is best fitted for in life.

**CASUALTY**—The person with a high percentage of casualty is a thinker and planner. Such men and women make good merchants, managers of stores, etc. They have originality and forethought; depth and comprehensiveness of mind; capable of adapting ways and means, creating resources and have good judgment. It depends upon the development of other qualities as to the success one has in this direction. He may be a Wanamaker or a small shopkeeper. If he is not successful it is because he lacks other essential qualities.

**CONTINUITY**—Those who have a high percentage of continuity of thought and action are indeed fortunate. It indicates the person who finishes everything as he goes, one thing at a time. He accomplishes more in one day than some people do in a week. An inventor, writer or artist who lacks continuity seldom succeeds. If you possess qualities which indicate that you are adapted for a profession or trade, find your percentage of continuity is low, you should develop this quality. Make up your mind to finish one thing at a time, and whenever you write a letter, be sure to connect all the letters in each word. This will develop continuity of thought.



**ART**—In art, one should have good powers of imagination. A high percentage in imagination and execution makes the artist and poet. Ideality, taste, refinement, love of perfection, flowers, purity, beauty, elegance, personal neatness, style and finish, produce the true artist. An artist may have a high percentage in art, but if he is lacking in other qualities his success as an eminent artist would not come until he has developed those qualities above mentioned. Many persons who excel in other lines because of their development have a high percentage in art, but the quality may be dormant and undeveloped.

**TUNE**—A high percentage in tune denotes musical tendencies, the ability to learn tunes by ear and repeat them by note; musical inspiration, genius, and a memory of sounds. The successful musician must have other good developments as well. The higher order of intelligence, the greater the musician. In some cases a high degree in tune denotes a great love of harmony, music, and singing, where the ability to execute has not been developed.

**MEMORY**—If the percentage in memory is low, it is a great detriment in any line of work. If it is high, the person has a keen, penetrating mind; is systematic and orderly and usually succeeds in any undertaking. Hotel keepers, insurance men, traveling salesmen, and those catering to masses of people, usually have good powers of memory. To be able to address thousands of persons by their proper names is essential to success in the above-mentioned occupations. The memory can be developed to a remarkable degree through concentrated effort. In evidence of this we submit the fact that a young colored boy who has charge of the hat and coat room of a large hotel attends to five hundred guests daily and gives each person his hat and cloak without a check system. He remembers each person and identifies each hat and coat. So much for concentration.

**WEIGHT**—A high percentage in weight indicates the sailor; balancing capacity; marksmanship; ability to keep one's balance in high places; walking aloft, climbing, sailing, steeple climbing, etc., and an intuitive perception and application of the laws of gravity and motion. It depends upon the percentage of other qualities as to whether a person is adapted for a steeplejack or a sea captain.

**IMAGINATION**—A high percentage in imagination is essential to success in art, literature, and the artistic arrangement of decorations, displays, advertising, etc. A good imagination is a valuable quality, where other indications are good. If the percentage in imagination is high and all other qualities low, it is liable to get one into all kinds of trouble and physical disorder.

## WHAT MOLES INDICATE.

### Great Significance Attaches to These Skin Blemishes.

Moles are nothing more nor less than excrescences which are caused by the state of the blood before birth, yet they are, like many other things, given for a purpose, as they show the characteristics and dispositions of those that have them. The larger the mole the greater the prosperity or adversity of the person. If the mole is round it indicates good, and if oblong, evil fortune. The darker the color the more it announces disgrace; the lighter, the better favor. If very hairy, it indicates misfortune. If but few long hairs grow upon it, it denotes prosperity.

Moles correspond with the Signs of the Zodiac. Persons born in Aries, the first month of the solar year, will have moles on the head or face, while those born in Pisces, the last month of the solar year, will have them on the feet. Always allow for the plane of birth.

A mole on the right side of the head signifies that the person will obtain sudden wealth and honor. On the left side indicates unexpected disappointment. On the outside corner of either eye means a sudden or violent death. On either cheek a rise in fortune. On the nose signifies success in business. A mole on either lip shows the person to be fond of pleasure and successful in their love affairs. A mole on the neck signifies unexpected success in money matters by marriage or inheritance. It also signifies danger from drowning or suffocation. A mole on the right breast indicates slow understanding and an amorous disposition, also success in all undertakings. One on the left breast signifies sudden reverses in fortune and unavoidable accidents. On the stomach denotes selfishness, carelessness and fondness for eating. On the back it means pride, self-respect, generosity, quick understanding, love of travel, etc.

A mole on either hip indicates a large family, many children, fortune in marriage. On the right thigh, hip or knee, adversity. On the right ankle or foot shows a person of dominant disposition, fond of dress, active, courageous and industrious. On the left ankle or foot denotes a person of effeminate disposition, timid, lazy and careless. Moles on the ankle are significant of honor, riches and success in love affairs. Moles on the arms indicate resolution, conjugal fidelity, success in business, happiness and contentment in life. A mole on either ear denotes riches. On either elbow shows a restless, unsteady disposition, great desire for traveling, and unpleasant adventures in married life. A mole on the right eyebrow indicates an active disposition. On the left eyebrow the opposite. A mole on the hands shows a dishonest character in some way.

## PLANETS HAVE A CERTAIN INFLUENCE OVER YOU.

Centuries ago mankind believed that human destiny and events were fixed and governed by the stars and heavenly bodies of the universe. These stars were grouped and named by the ancient astrologers in accordance with the prevailing belief. It is becoming more recognized every day that astrology while an old science is regarded more favorably by the public generally and we find the leading newspapers of the country publishing daily horoscopes. The science of Astrology has not changed with the ages. It is true that many sneered at the idea of persons being governed by certain planets and astrological conditions, but this fact is occupying the attention of deep thinkers and scholars throughout the world. There are still some people who call Astrology all nonsense, but there are others—those who have studied it—who believe that Astrology is the most exact of sciences and who declare that planets do rule destinies.

What is meant by the lucky and unlucky days of astrology? The unlucky days of astrology are those days of each month in which the moon sign coincides with the earth sign under which the person was born. For instance a person born under Taurus will pass through the moon sign Taurus once a month. The earth sign occurs only once a year. Whenever, therefore, the moon sign coincides with the earth sign it has the effect of intensifying the peculiar traits of that particular sign. Other things, being equal, these will be unlucky days for a person born under that sign, as his mental characteristics are greatly intensified. By lucky days are meant simply those signs in which the earth sign is more modified or balanced by the opposing moon sign. This tends toward repressing the natural characteristics, and other things being equal, the person will be in a more balanced, normal state of mind, which leads them to the things which bring about good results and are termed lucky. In the strict sense of the words there are no lucky and unlucky days. Therefore, all that is meant by Astrological lucky and unlucky days is that on those particular days the signs governing each person are favorable to the production of right conduct or the opposite.

The astrologers took as the basis for their beliefs the Zodiac or Zone in the heavens within which the earth, moon, planets, and apparently, the sun moves. This one they divided into twelve parts, corresponding with the twelve divisions of the year. Within each house was placed a constellation or sign and in selecting the signs something familiar was evidently preferred; hence, we have the crab, the ram, the fishes, etc. These signs were given control over certain portions of the human body and the ancients believed that every living person possessed characteristics peculiar to the star under which they were born, and that these characteristics exercised a material influence over their entire lives.

From the remotest beginnings of the written history of man has come down to us the whisperings of this starry Zodiac. Astrologers claim that a science which has stood the test of centuries, that has outlived nations under the careful scrutiny of the most learned men of ages, must certainly have something more than mere superstition for its foundation. As stated the Zodiacal signs were divided into twelve houses and these again were divided into four classes, according as they relate to Earth, Air, Fire and Water.

Aries, Leo and Sagittarius were assigned to the domain of Fire;

Taurus, Virgo and Capricorn to the domain of Earth;

Gemini, Libra and Aquarius to the domain of Air, and Cancer, Scorpio and Pisces to the domain of Water.

It was believed that if persons born in those various triplicities, as they are termed, marry, bringing inharmonious qualities together (as, for instance, Fire and Water, or Air and Earth), domestic infelicity is the almost certain result, and persons who each alone possess good qualities find themselves so unhappily mated that living together is impossible. It is well for those contemplating matrimony to look into the birth star of the persons they want to marry to see if there is a harmony of characteristics between them.

Persons who are born during the first six days after the sun passes from one sign to another are said to have been born under the Cusp, and are apt to partake of the characteristics of both signs. This may be advantageous or otherwise, according as the signs are harmonious or not.

## PALMISTRY MADE EASY

### Giving the Fundamental Principals of the Language of the hand

#### TO READ THE PALMS.

The student when reading the palms or hands should have both hands of the subject before him. The left hand reveals his character and disposition; the right hand shows his fate, vocation, talent, etc. The left hand is what he is; the right is what he makes himself. After making a short study you will be able to decide which hand to go by. That is to say, the lines on the left hand are strengthened by those on the right; if there are Fate, Heart and Marriage lines on the left hand and not in the right hand, the subject does not possess the strong qualities they denote.

The easiest and best way to read the hands is first, to note the Type of Hand, whether Square, Conic or other shape, telling what this type of hand denotes. Then go to the Thumbs and Fingers, thence to the Lines and Mounts, thus following out the arrangement of this book.

#### PALMISTRY MADE EASY.

##### CHAPTER I.

There are seven different types of Hands, as follows:

- The Square or Energetic Hand.
- The Spatulate or Inventive Hand.
- The Conic or Artistic Hand.
- The Philosophic or Nature Hand.
- The Psychic or Pleasure-loving Hand.
- The Mixed or the Unmastered Hand.

The Elementary or Brutal Hand; this type of hand I have omitted, as it is rarely found. This style of hand has a coarse and clumsy palm and fingers, with poor development, and denotes an animal and brutal nature such as a savage possesses.

There are seven Mounts, four under the fingers, two under thumb and one on the side of Palm, as follows:

- Under the first finger, Mt. Jupiter.
- Under the second finger, Mt. Saturn.
- Under the third finger, Mt. Sun.
- Under the fourth or little finger, Mt. Mercury.
- Under the thumb, Mt. Venus and Mt. Mars.
- On the side of the Palm, Mt. Luna.

There are six main lines on the Hand, which are as follows:

- The Life Line, which surrounds the Thumb.
- The Head Line, which lies in the center of the Hand.
- The Heart Line, which lies high up on the Palm.
- The Fate Line, which commences at the wrist or above and runs up toward the fingers.
- The Marriage Line, which lies on the outside of Palm.
- The Vocation Line, which runs parallel with the Fate Line.

#### SQUARE HAND

##### CHAPTER II.

The Square Hand has a square palm, with either short or long fingers, the tips of the fingers square, the nails short and square, the skin usually firm and hard. This type of hand denotes a person full of energy of purpose, conforming to theory, methodical, an orderly, punctual and precise nature, a slave to habit, fond of home and domestic life, sincere and strong in friendship, upright and strong in principle. The one great fault of its owners is that they do not believe until the see for themselves.

Short fingers show a person apt to be narrow-minded and obstinate, yet one who will accumulate wealth after a hard struggle.

Fingers long and well developed show the person has exceptional ability, power and reason and, with well developed lines, one who is bound to attain success.

Spatulate fingers show a love for practical things, an originator, an inventor. Conic fingers show an artistic and musical nature.

Psychic fingers denote one who lacks energy; he starts well and means well, but gives up too soon.

#### SPATULATE HAND

##### CHAPTER III.

The Spatulate Hand is wide at the wrist and narrow at the base, or broad at the base of the fingers and narrow at the wrist. A skin hard and firm shows a restless and excitable nature, yet one full of energy and one who will act promptly; quick in practical things.

Fingers long with developed joints show the person has inventive ability, possessing independence of action which makes him or her go far and deep into things. They have peculiarities of their own and are fond of mathematics and engineering.

#### THE CONIC HAND

##### CHAPTER IV.

The Conic Hand has small tapering fingers, the palm tapering to the base of the fingers, the skin soft and tender. This hand denotes a sensitive and impulsive nature, one who will interfere with other people's affairs and is fond of criticising, a lover of luxury and indolence. Such a person is influenced by others and surroundings, says what he or she thinks, is generous and sympathetic. Such persons rise from the lowest state of despair to the highest state of rapture, they are kind hearted and preach to others what they do not practice themselves.

When the fingers are long it shows a more artistic nature, and one who would make a good critic. The owner of such fingers seeks everything that is artistic and beautiful.

#### THE PHILOSOPHICAL HAND.

##### CHAPTER V.

The Philosophical Hand has a long and narrow palm, with long, thin fingers, developed points and thin almond-shaped nails. The possessor of such a hand loves to study human nature, which influences his methods, meditates before acting, is quiet, sedate and very particular, haughty and egotistical, rarely forgets insult or injury; yet is very patient and has a fondness for everything artistic and beautiful.

Such characters like the mysterious. Money is not their ambition in life; what they seek is fame. They desire to be different from others in their pursuits and action.

This character of a hand is generally found among clergymen and those of the religious order, as it reveals a nature that loves to study and better mankind.

## THE PSYCHIC HAND.

## CHAPTER VI.

The Psychic Hand is the most beautiful type of all hands. It has a long and narrow palm with long delicate tapering fingers, the skin white and tender with almond shaped nails. The possessors have a beautiful disposition generally brought up under parental guidance, yet they are weak, have a calm disposition and frequently care little for the opposite sex. They lack courage and strength, cannot hold their own with people, are very emotional and are influenced by people and their appearances.

Men with such hands are fond of gambling and earthly pleasures, generally unsuccessful in business world. Many tramps and the falling aristocracy of human kind have this sort of hand.

## THE MIXED HAND.

## CHAPTER VII.

The Mixed Hand has more of an oval-shaped palm, with mixed fingers, as the Conic, Spatulate and Square, etc., the skin rough and flexible. This character of hand denotes people who can do a little of everything, jacks of all trades and masters of none. They are very good talkers, as they can converse superficially on any subject; they take life in an easy way, rarely ever raising or lowering their position are fond of travel and excitement, generally popular wherever they may be thrown. This hand is possessed by many actors.

## THUMBS.

## CHAPTER VIII.

The Thumb is the most important feature of the hand and should be carefully studied and consulted before forming your opinion of a person's characteristics. It should be examined in connection with the other lines in the hand, as it strengthens or weakens many a good or bad factor shown elsewhere in the hand. The Thumb is made up in three parts; the first or nail phalange and second and third phalanges.

If the first phalange is longer than the second or third, it shows the subject possesses great will power and determination; if nearly twice the length of the second phalange, a stubborn disposition; and if the thumb is short, a very narrow mind with little intellect. If the second phalange is as long as the first, it shows the subject has logic and reason, and if longer than the first has not enough will to carry out plans, but depends entirely upon others.

When the third phalange is nearly as long as the second, it denotes a passionate nature and a person who is apt to give up to the sensual side of life, especially if Mt. Venus is well developed.

When the Thumb is long and firm, not easily bent back, it shows a cautious and reserved nature, which sticks to one thing and makes the best of everything; is very energetic and knows the value of money.

If supple and easily bent back, it shows an extravagant and unreserved disposition; the possessors can adapt themselves to anything or any circumstances.

When the thumb has a wrist-shaped appearance, it denotes refinement and tact. A clumsy and coarse appearance shows a coarse and vulgar nature.

## THE FINGERS

## CHAPTER IX.

When the subject has smooth joints with tapering fingers, it shows a very sensitive nature and yet one which is generally indifferent to others.

Developed joints denote people of common sense and methodical in their work, fond of analyzing and going deep into things, observant and thoughtful.

Long fingers denote love of detail; thick fingers, cruelty and selfishness; firm and stiff fingers, a cowardly nature; crooked fingers, a deceitful and unprincipled nature.

When the first finger is longer than the third, it shows one who desires to rule and domineer over others; when nearly as long as the second fingers, the same quality, but a person who will be ashamed of his poor relations and associates if he raises to a prominent position.

When the third finger is longer than the first, it shows a person who is fond of gambling and speculation, and when it is as long or nearly as long as the second finger a morbid nature and one who takes life as a lottery.

When the fourth or little finger is long, reaching above the first phalange of the third finger, it shows one who can converse with ease; and when reaching far above this phalange line, indicates great power of expression.

When the first phalange is longer than the second or third phalange on the finger, the person is untruthful and misrepresents at times.

When this finger is short it shows the possessors cannot express themselves with ease, and when poorly developed, that what they say is not worth listening to.

## THE MOUNTS.

## CHAPTER X.

A Mount is a raised part or pad on the palm of the hand, there being seven important ones, four under fingers, two under thumb and one on the side of the palm.

Under the first finger is Mt. Jupiter, which, if well developed and placed, shows ambition, self-respect, a love of display and a very vain person.

A Star found on this mount shows great success will be attained; a Cross on the mount, a happy marriage.

Under the second finger is Mt. Saturn; well developed it shows one who is prudent and fond of solitude, with a fondness for agriculture and its pursuits. If the mount is badly placed, it signifies one who is always finding fault with others and everything.

When a Star is found on this mount it means success in science. A Cross on it means a leaning toward science and a superstitious nature.

Under the third finger is Mt. Sun. If well developed it shows people who are fond of art and music, if badly placed, a tendency to overestimate their ability.

A Star on the mount means success and prominence through art; a Cross on it, lack of display and loss of self interest.

Under the fourth or little finger is Mt. Mercury. If well developed the subject has a keen sense of business and a fondness for speculating. If the subject has a long little finger and a good clear head line, he has an aptitude for law and its vocation; with spatulate fingers a fondness for chemistry. If the mount lies toward the third finger the individual is fond of wit, excitement and travel. If the mount leans toward the side of the palm it shows a deceitful and unprincipled nature.

A Star on this mount means success through speculations; a Cross on the mount, an unsettled disposition in business affairs.

On the side of palm is Mt. Luna. If well developed, a gentle and imaginative nature is indicated.

Under the thumb is Mt. Venus. If well developed, shows an affectionate disposition, and over-developed, a very passionate one.

Above the Mount of Venus, Mt. Mars, when developed, denotes a brave and courageous person.

In judging the developments of the mounts, a well-developed mount is one that is higher than the others. When they are all of the same development it means that the subject possesses a small amount of each of these characteristics.

## THE LINE OF LIFE.

## CHAPTER XI.

If the Line of Life is long and clearly cut without breaks, it denotes a strong, healthy, person; if it sweeps far into the palm of the hand and terminates at the wrist, a long and healthful life. When the line is not clear the individual is weak and unhealthy, and when broken foretells illness. A decided break in the same place in both hands generally means death.

When the line commences at the base of Mt. Jupiter it shows ambition from early life; if without break and clear, good health in youth.

When it commences at Head Line, the head governs the life. When the line is a little distance from the Head Line, independence in thought and ideas is shown; when far distant, a foolhardy and simple person.

When the lines of Head, Heart and Life all join, the subject does everything without reason and is always in trouble of some kind.

When the line sends an offshoot to Mt. Luna, the subject will die away from his birthplace. An offshoot to Mt. Jupiter predicts a rise in social affairs; to Mt. Saturn a gain in wealth through inheritance; to Mt. Sun ambition gratified by traveling; to Mt. Mercury success in business; all these good fortunes being attained by the individual's own energy and perseverance.

All small lines cutting the life line mean interference of others with their plans at the time they appear.

## THE LINE OF HEAD.

## CHAPTER XII.

The Line of Head commences at three different points, from the bottom of Mt. Jupiter at the Life Line; at Mt. Mars under Jupiter.

The Line of Head refers to the mental condition and temperament of the subject. Commencing at Mt. Jupiter and separate from Life Line, it denotes a self-reliant, yet hasty person, in reasoning and deciding; when the space is very wide, a foolhardy individual.

When the line rises from the Life Line, it shows a cautious and careful disposition, tidy in appearance and full of energy.

When it commences at the Mount of Mars, it denotes a fretful and worrying disposition, a nervous and sensitive temperament.

When the line is straight and running clear across the hand, the person is very bright and intellectual, what he or she says is practical; when it ends in a fork, the subject has literary talent; the longer the fork the greater the talent. If the line has a gradual slope, the owner has a great deal of imagination, and is generally an incessant talker.

When the line runs parallel with the Life Line, it shows idealism with little ambition for honor or glory and fondness for Bohemianism.

All lines rising from the Head Line show that the subject by his own ability will accomplish or pursue the ambitions denoted by the mounts to which they rise, as follows:

- To Mt. Jupiter, fame and honor.
- To Mt. Saturn, science.
- To Mt. Sun, art or music.
- To Mt. Mercury, the business world.

## THE LINE OF HEART.

## CHAPTER XIII.

When the Line of Heart commences at the top of Mt. Jupiter, it shows sincere and reliable affections, generally persons whose aims are high and noble.

When the line starts between the first and second fingers, they are jealous, carry their affections to extremes and are apt to be fickle.

The line rising from Mt. Saturn shows a selfish disposition and one inclined to be cold to others.

All small lines cutting the heart line mean flirtation; break on the line, disappointments in love at the time they may appear.

The line broken under Mt. Jupiter shows disappointment in business caused by the affections; under Mt. Saturn, accident caused by the affections; under Mt. Sun pride and conceit caused by the affections; under Mt. Mercury, quarrels with the opposite sex (or wife or husband) in many cases divorce.

When the line runs clear across the hand and sends a branch to Mt. Jupiter, it means a happy and tranquil nature.

When there are no small lines cutting or dropping from the Heart Line, the owner cares little for the opposite sex.

When the line is low down on the palm of the hand and lying near the Line of Head, the heart controls the head.

When the Heart, Head and Life lines all join, it shows people who stop at nothing until they gain their end. Many prisoners have this characteristic in their hands.

No line of Heart in Hand shows little affection.

## THE LINE OF FATE.

## CHAPTER XIV.

The Line of Fate relates to our worldly affairs, fate, fortune, prosperity and failures in life.

When the line rises from the bottom of Mt. Luna the subject has been spoiled by parents, and when the line runs up to the finger to Mt. Saturn, the subject will have good and great luck in everything undertaken.

When the line rises up from the wrist and runs clear up to base of fingers toward Mt. Jupiter, great success will be accomplished by the individual unaided; and if it runs into the line of Heart, wealth gained through marriage.

When a line runs up from Mt. Luna and cuts through Fate Line, others have interfered with opportunities.

When the Fate Line is stopped by the line of Heart, the individual has cut himself off from better opportunities through his affections.

When the line is stopped or broken by the Line of Head, the subject has made great blunder through stupidity, and has neglected an opportunity of gratifying ambition. However, if the Fate Line is stopped by these lines (Head and Heart Lines) and then continues on again it means that he has injured his fortune for the time being.

When the line sends an offshoot to any of the Mounts, such as to Mt. Mercury, the subject will become famous in the talent denoted by the rest of the hand. An offshoot to Mt. Saturn spells success in science, to Mt. Sun, in art, to Mt. Mercury, in business.

If the line commences in the middle of Life Line, opportunities will come later in life for the individual.

If it commences at Heart Line, an inheritance through marriage.

## THE LINE OF MARRIAGE.

## CHAPTER XV.

The Line of Marriage lies on the side of the hand between the Heart Line and the line that surrounds the little finger.

Closer to the Heart Line it means an early marriage; farther away, a marriage later in life. When the Line is perfectly bare, the subject is not likely to marry, and

if the line has small lines cutting through it and also forking, it is a sure sign of marriage. These small cutting lines are the number of children the couple will have.

A wealthy marriage is shown by a line rising up from Fate Line.

When the line runs far into the palm of the hand and sends an offshoot to Mt. Sun, the subject will marry one of prominence and of an artistic nature.

When the line is short and ends in a fork, the lower branch longer than the upper one, an unhappy marriage is shown, and when the line drops so far as to cut the Line of Heart, divorce.

When a line rises up from Mt. Luna, the person will marry one of a humbler position.

All small lines that are lying between the Heart Line and the line of the little finger mean flirtations at the time they appear.

The Line of Marriage should be clearly cut on both the right and the left hand, and the right hand should be used in deciding all these facts.

## THE LINE OF VOCATION.

### CHAPTER XVI.

The Line of Vocation runs parallel with the Fate Line and denotes the subject will be successful according to what mounts it sweeps to. To Mt. Mercury, prosperity in business; to Mt. Saturn, success in agriculture; to Mt. Sun, fame in art, science and music.

When the line commences nearly as low as the Fate Line, the subject has inherited money early in life.

When the line commences in center of palm the person will make money through speculation.

Many hands do not possess this line, and in such cases the qualities this line denotes are determined by the mounts and other lines in the hand.

## THE SQUARES.

### CHAPTER XVII.

A square is made up of four lines that form a square, and wherever found indicates preservation at the time it appears. If on the Life Line the subject was protected from illness or accident, provided the Life Line is broken in the Square.

A square on the Head Line means preservation from mishaps or diseases of the head.

A square on the Heart Line means oncoming trouble in love and affections.

A square on the Fate Line, salvation from ruin or failure in money matters.

A square on Mt. Jupiter, avoidance of social scandal.

A square on Mt. Saturn, escape from sudden death.

A square on Mt. Sun, release from travel.

A square on Mt. Mercury, escape from disgrace in business.

## THE CROSSES.

### CHAPTER XVIII.

A Cross, when found on Mt. Jupiter, means a happy marriage.

A Cross on Mt. Saturn means the one who enters your life will be of a scientific nature.

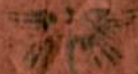
